

Synopsis of the George Walker Family Tree

(Researchers note: This was produced by Peter G. Walker, at least prior to 1895 based on statements of specific individuals "still living" and known death dates.)

George Walker and his brother, Thomas, together with their sister, Mary, and her husband, whom she had married in Ireland, John Dallas, came to America from Ireland in 1750.

John Dallas and his wife settled on the Sassafras river, in Delaware, and the connection was not kept up between the families.

Thomas, after a few years spent in South Carolina, settled in Richmond County, GA, near Hephzibah, in 1756, and raised a large family. Many of his descendants are still living in that county.

George Walker settled on Brier Creek, in Burke county, and in 1756 married Mary Duhart. They had twelve children born to them as follows:

- 1st. Mary, born Dec. 10, 1757. She married General William Byne and had five children, Martha, Margaret, Elijah, Enoch, and Mary. There are no living descendants of this branch.
- 2nd. Esther, born Feb. 29, 1759. She married ----- Carter and lived in Burke county. They had two children, Margaret Allen and Mary Stone. A number of descendants of Mary Stone are living in Richmond, Wilkes, and Thomas counties.
- 3rd. John Walker, born Sept. 5, 1760. He Married Frances Byne, a sister of General William Byne and had four children, Issac, Edmund, John B., and Eliza Dawson. He moved from Burke to Morgan county in 1810, and a number of his descendants are still living there.
(researchers note: Peter G. Walker, the author of this work, was the son of Edmund Walker in this family branch).
- 4th. Elizabeth, born Dec. 25, 1761. She married John Jones, lived in Burke county, and had seven children, Mary, George, Esther, Eliza, Rebecca, John, and Margaret A. A number of her descendants are living in Burke, Bibb, an Fulton counties.
- 5th. George Walker, born Nov. 14, 1763, settled at Longstreet in Pulaski county, and had nine children, Joel, Rebecca, Polly, George, David, Thomas D., Charles, Sarah, and Betsy. A number of his descendants are now living in Pulaski County.
- 6th. William Walker, born Sept. 5, 1765. He settled first in Putnam, then moved to Harris county; commonly called "Old Rich Billy." He had seven children, Dr. Austin M., Thacker, Virgil, David E., William, George, Lucian, and Polly. some of his descendants live in Pulaski county, and some live in Alabama.

(Researchers note - there is an error in the listing of offspring. "George" was William's middle name, and a son, John Thacker, twin brother to Thacker, is not listed. Also, Lucian is a misspelling, and Polly is a nickname for Mary. The list should read: Dr. Austin M., Thacker, John T., Virgil, David E., William G., Lucina, and Mary (Polly).)

7th. Rebecca, borne Oct. 5, 1767. She married Henry Byne and had three children, Thomas, Edmund, and Henry. Their branch is now extinct

8th. Thomas Walker, born Feb. 5, 1769; could learn nothing of him, he either never married or never reached maturity.

9th David Walker, born Nov. 8, 1771 }

10th. Enoch, born Jan. 22, 1773}

These brothers lived together on a farm on Little river, in Morgan county. Neither ever married. They each died in their 44th year and are buried beside their brother, John Walker, in the old Walker grave yard in Morgan county.

11th. Margaret, born Jan. 30, 1775; Married Reuben Reynolds in Burke county and had five children, Thomas, Walker, Margaret, Reuben Y., and John. A number of her descendants are now living in Alabama.

12th. Moses Walker, born May 2, 1776; had six children, Frank, Moses, Margaret, Maria, Alex, and Isaiah. I have been unable to fully develop this branch, yet believe there are other of his descendants living; some of them now in Morgan county.

The trunk of the tree represents the originator of the family in America - George Walker. His children are represented by the twelve main branches, whose names and birth dates are shown in this synopsis.

Each branch bears the name of one child. Only the given names of the sons are put on their representative branches, while each daughter has her given name, and if she married, her marriage name also on her branch.

Realizing how little the younger generation know of their family connection, by my own ignorance, I felt that the satisfaction of knowing more of it would be well worth the effort it would cost. With this feeling I undertook what seemed to be an impossible task, and have carried it out as far as a diligent search would enable me. I have enjoyed the letters of those who gave me the necessary information, and it is with a feeling of regret that the work is closed.

This record will go to a number of families who have heretofore known nothing of the family connection. I hope it will stimulate a feeling closer relationship among all members of the family who may feel enough interest in it to study it, and that it may prove as pleasant to all concerned as it has been to me.
